# Waikato Hockey Association Board of Governance. Chairman's report - March 2012.

Our vision, New Zealand's leading hockey Association.

**Our values**, passion, trust, honesty, loyalty, teamwork, friendliness, respectfulness, professionalism and sportsmanship.

**Our mission**, provide an environment for the enjoyment, growth and development of hockey for all in the Waikato region.

It is with pleasure that I present my report on behalf of the Waikato Hockey Association Board of Governance.

On behalf of your board I would thank everybody for their support through the current year, I feel proud to have been able to Chair a dynamic board on behalf of the association.

Your board whilst we have had some hearty discussions around challenges, we have in every case been unified and worked together towards the vision of being New Zealand's leading hockey Association and for this I thank every one of you.

This year has been one of formalising policies and procedures to improve practices within the hockey community, practices that involved coaching, high-performance, umpires and volunteers and players.

Your Board continues to be very impressed with the operational team currently in place and has been assisting this team by providing guidance as needed on policies and procedures.

Last year saw a complete review of health and safety policies and procedures, ensuring that from an occupational health and safety perspective we are providing a safe environment for the hockey community, this year we were able to add to this the onsite defibrillator, a great step up.

December 2010 saw a decision made to move ahead with a replacement turf. This decision was inevitable as the playing surface on Turf two had deteriorated significantly and was in need of replacement.

I would imagine you've all seen the benefits of the new turf over the past season and whilst the new turf redirected some of our funds away from a new pavilion this year a top priority will be to set up a sponsorship committee dedicated to raising the additional funds needed to push ahead with our new pavilion extension.

We have looked at numerous options for the new pavilion one of which allowed us to build it in two parts, thus trying to work within our fiscal constraints, but even with a multi-staged project we were still a little shy on funding. 2012 will be the year we change this.

Your board is committed to being fiscally prudent; something we have discussed previously but if you remember back to 2009 we had a loss of \$32,000, 2010 brought us a surplus of \$200 and it was our intention as a board to provide a sustainable surplus going forward.

We are pleased to announce a surplus of \$8,650 for the year, putting us in good shape for the future.

One of your Boards objectives in the future is to ensure a surplus every year whilst enhancing the overall value proposition; this will ensure that we have a sustainable program as regards future funding requirements, without additional financial pressures being applied to players.



This year Hamilton City Council provided excellent assistance with our replacement water turf, agreeing also for continued support for each replacement turf in the future, an excellent outcome initiated by Declan.

I am exciting to be continuing this journey to build on the successful Waikato hockey programme, with over 3000 registered players in the region, with leadership positions in many areas of our Hockey programs, and a dynamic set of people operating in many areas of our association it is an exciting time for us.

Our challenge during 2011 was the NZ Hockey regionalisation program, your board has put tremendous effort and resources behind developing a plan for a regionalisation structure, and we have made small progress on what is seen as a long journey.

One thing you can be sure on is that the Waikato identity in any regionalisation structure will be strong going forward. Your board is committed to ensuring the majority of our efforts are focused on Waikato initiatives never losing sight of our original objectives; growing numbers and enhancing the experience of lifetime hockey.

This year saw Cherie operating out of the hockey pavilion; this initiative has allowed us to foster much closer ties with the Midlands Organisation.

This year we concluded small constitutional changes in the Midlands constitution and the opportunity for a constitutional review in 2012; this will allow us to ensure we maintain a strong position in any regionalisation program. It is exciting to know that we have the resources, and governance structures in place coupled with the expertise in our Association to be able to assist with Hockey New Zealand's regionalisation program.

As was the challenge last year, I think the challenge for your board this coming year will be to ensure that communication to the wider community is improved, that regular communication and newsletters provide a new level of communication around the activities and opportunities within the hockey community.

I thank you all for your continued support and look forward to being able to assist in the coming year.

## CEO's Report

2011 was my second year as CEO of Waikato Hockey.

The year started with an urgent need to replace our number 2 turf. We were hoping to get a further season out of it, but to do that we would have had to spend approximately \$50,000 in temporary repairs to get us through the season. We decided that we needed to get on and replace the turf. We were fortunate that a large grant we had from the Perry Foundation was able to be used for the turf rather than for the new pavilion which was its original intention.

We all know and are working hard to get a new pavilion, but the turf definitely took priority as without excellent surfaces to play on has to be our first priority for all our players.

We also negotiated a very good arrangement with the Hamilton City Council who not only paid for one third of the Turf 2 replacement they also entered into a long term agreement to pay one third of all future turf replacements at Gallagher Hockey Centre.

One of the big areas we focused on this year was the development of players, from the beginners right through to the High Performance athletes we have in the Waikato. To achieve this we split the coach roles between participation and High Performance. We were lucky enough to secure the services of Hymie Gill on a part time basis to undertake the role of High Performance Manager. This meant that Jack Clayton could fully concentrate of the grass roots and participation part of the sport.

We have seen immediate effects of this decision. We had more Rep Teams this year (with development teams in both Under 18 Boys and Girls and a Senior Men's and Woman's teams) and our results across the Rep Tournaments have been far more consistent and improving, moving us towards our strategic goal of top 4 finishes in all National Tournaments

Also our High Performance unit has started a number of Academies for different age groups. We have employed the services of a fitness trainer / athletics coach and are trying to make all our athletes fitter, faster and stronger to be at the top of their game.

On the participation side of hockey, freeing up Jack's time and with Cat Finlayson in her Kiwisport Role, they managed between them some outstanding results. Some of the highlights of those results are;

- Primary schools visited 306
- Secondary schools visited 26
- Number of Coaches/Teachers/Parents trained 282
- Coaching workshops and courses conducted 34
- Number of children coached 9,168

2012 will see the Year 5 & 6 program further developed. All 8 Associations in the Northern Region have undertaken a project to examine what is best for the children of this age group. Recently there has been Rep Tournaments for the year 5 & 6 age group, but it is felt that the skill development at this age has not been focused enough, and there are many children of equal ability who miss out on the opportunity. For this reason 2012 will see WHA launching an exciting Hockey School and program for the year 5 & 6 children, both in Hamilton and outlying Waikato Towns.

One other area we have taken a stand this year is on our Brand. We have entered into an arrangement Kukri so that 'all' teams representing Waikato have the same professional look and feel about them.

We have looked at a number of different options this year for increased usage at our Gallagher facility as well as opportunities to develop indoor again in the region. We welcome the Hinemoa Athletics club here in 2011 and will continue



to build on that relationship in 2012 along with the one we continue to enjoy with Marching. WHA along with Basketball, Netball, Football and Volleyball undertook extensive work to design an indoor facility to fit all of these sports. It was a very exciting concept the sports working together to design a facility to suit all of their needs rather than sports running off and all building their own facilities. Unfortunately the project is now on the back burner due to Council funding issues, but we hope it will be resurrected in the not too distant future.

The future challenges for Waikato Hockey and every other Association is Regionalisation. Basically Regionalisation is about sharing resources throughout a Region for the betterment of all Association's without losing any local flavour, culture or pride. Quite a simple message, but a huge task to get buy in from in our case 5 fundamentally different organisations who are all at different stages in their development. I have spent a great deal of time this year fronting this project for the region in my role as MAG's (Midlands Association's Group) Chair. At WHA we have taken the view point that Regionalisation will happen and there are some great benefits in it if it is done well. But, we want to be at the forefront of it to ensure that we are the controllers of our own destiny. 2012 will see some exciting developments and we have done the leg work to use this to our best advantage.

Waikato is being seen nationally as a very progressive association and because of this we have had all sorts of benefits such as hosting of 4 Test matches in 2011, being invited onto working groups for Hockey NZ projects and generally being consulted on issues within hockey.

2011 has seen a greater focus on communication with the new website up and running and the Facebook page underway, but 2012 we are having a big focus on further improving the communication throughout the Association.

Our Strategic Plan is into its second year and is proving to be an excellent guiding document to base our decisions and future on. The Board have undertaken an annual review of the plan and are happy that we are still on track and still have the right focuses.

This has just been an overview of the year we have had, there are exciting things going on all the time, but I have just highlighted some of them above, which leaves me just one thing to do...... thank everyone!

Where to start? There are so many people to thank in this Association, for so many different reasons. We have the best volunteers in the country, we have some people that dedicate hours and hours every week to help out with a variety of activities around here to ensure that WHA functions well. Then there is the Board who work tirelessly and unselfishly to achieve the best outcomes for hockey, then there is the WHA staff...... to Denise, Kirsten, Jack, Cat and Hymie, thank you for all you have done all year. I don't think there are many people who appreciate just how much work you do and the hours you put into Waikato Hockey. All I can say is we are very lucky we don't have to pay you an hourly rate and lucky that you continue to do what you do with such a positive attitude and a focus on the best for hockey.

And to everyone in Waikato Hockey, players, families, volunteers, staff etc. it is my pleasure to represent you and always nice to take the credit for all that has been done in Waikato over the years to make it the Association it is.



## Key Strategic Objective - 1. School Kids

An area we lead New Zealand in is the number of Mini Kids we have playing hockey and the total number of children playing hockey in the Waikato is very impressive. We want to continue to increase this base and further encourage these children to choose Hockey for life.

#### Our Targets under our strategic plan are;

- 1. To get more children into hockey, aiming for a 5% per year increase in participation.
- 2. To achieve 80% retention of children once they leave school.
- 3. A fully documented development plan including stages for children and levels to achieve.
- 4. A fully documented plan for increasing the number and quality of coaches for juniors.
- 5. A minimum of 10 newly qualified coaches per year.

- Primary schools visited 306

# Key Strategic Objective - 2. Seniors and Clubs

Whilst we lead the country in our junior programs our Club and senior numbers are not as good. We have major losses of players when they leave school (this is not only an issue for us, but for all sport) and so our senior numbers are low compared to our junior numbers.

Our Targets under our strategic plan are;

- 1. Research reasons for and ways of mitigating the percentage of young people who do not continue to play hockey once they leave school.
- 2. Strengthen Clubs including their Administration.
- 3. Have pathways and opportunities (i.e. Summer Hockey) for people to get into hockey as adults, either returning to the sport or entering for the first time.
- 4. Particularly strengthen the women's competition.
  - 2011 major achievements
- 1. 6% growth in senior player numbers
- 2. Learn to play day held at Gallagher Hockey Centre, which attracted a number of new players.
- 3. 30% increase in Summer Hockey numbers into, and good enquiry from that to play winter hockey.





# Key Strategic Objective - 3. High Performance

We have separated out our High Performance program from our participation programs, so each part of the organisation can concentrate on its specific needs.

Our Targets under our strategic plan are;

- 1. Rep Teams at National Tournaments achieve Top 4 finishes consistently.
- 2. More players achieving National status in all levels.
- 3. To improve the level of all Waikato Representative teams.
- 4. A documented pathway for players and officials to help them achieve their potential.
- 5. A closer working relationship with Midlands to avoid crossovers and get a consistent direction.

- 1. Employment of Hymie Gill as Waikato High Performance Manager.
- 2. More rep teams competing including reintroduction of Senior Men's and Women's teams.
- 3. More consistent results over all Rep teams from the Association.
- 4. Introduction of Waikato Academy programs...





# Key Strategic Objective - 4. Asset Management

Our aim under Asset Management is to provide World Class hockey facilities in Hamilton. The Gallagher Hockey Centre currently has 2 water turfs and a pavilion. There are definite needs for better shower and toilet facilities at the centre.

Hockey NZ are completing an Infrastructure and Facilities project which will set out the facilities required for hosting tournaments and Test matches, we have seen the first draft of the Plan and know that our projected building plan would meet all the requirements of a Tier 2 venue and would go close to a Tier 1. This would mean that we could host most major Tournaments and Tests for Teams ranked 7 and below in the World.

2012 will see more progress towards the funding of the pavilion upgrade and the laying of replacement Turf 2.

- 1. Turf 2 replaced with the latest WETT surface
- 2. Council Agreement for one third of Turf 2 replacement and one third of future turf replacements
- 3. Further progress towards Pavilion Extensions





# Key Strategic Objective – 5. Administration / Communication

The role of the Waikato Hockey Association is to deliver all hockey in the Waikato. To do this we need superior administration services and excellent communication.

Our Targets under our strategic plan are;

- 1. Well document policies and procedures for all parts of the association.
- 2. To have email addresses for all our players (or their parents/guardians for the younger children) so we can communicate effectively and efficiently.
- 3. A written communication plan.
- 4. A written plan of the structures and responsibilities within Waikato Hockey association..

- 1. Waikato Hockey Association office roles and responsibilities reviewed.
- 2. New website platform and web provider, online registrations for entries and events.
- 3. Facebook Page Launched over 650 friends and plans for extension in 2012
- 4. New written policies and procedures defined and published
