

Level 2 – General Conditions of Entry for Waikato 5's Tournament (Saturday 6th March 2021)

For this Tournament each pool (2x men's and 1x women's) will be distinct group of less than 100 people. Any spectators will be a separate group. This means that there is to be no contact between teams from different pools and spectators. Social distancing of at least 2 metres is to be kept between people from different groups.

These rules are in place for Saturday, at this stage we are yet to be informed of what rules will apply to the Sunday.

By entering the Gallagher Hockey Centre, you agree to abide by these conditions of entry outlined below.

Everyone's Responsibilities

- Do not come to hockey if you are unwell. Stay home.
- People with underlying health conditions and those in the vulnerable age group over 70 should carefully consider whether they attend the facility.
- Come prepared to play in the correct gear – there are no changing facilities.
- Groups are limited to 100 people per group in accordance with regulations. Spectators will be allowed in the facility, but they are to keep social distancing from all players of at least 2 metres at all times. Each pool competing in the Tournament will be a separate group and the draw has been designed that groups do not need to come in contact with each other and must keep separate throughout the day.
- Practise good hygiene: cover coughs and sneezes with your elbow or tissue. Place used tissues in the bin. Avoid touching your mouth, nose and eyes.
- Follow required contact tracing protocols by scanning one of the multiple Covid-19 QR codes (or manually complete personal details on forms provided) in the entrance tunnel. No access will be allowed without signing in.
- Avoid breaching any physical distance requirements between groups at communal spaces directly outside the facility (e.g. perimeter gates and carparks) or inside the facility.
- Go directly to the correct turf. Players must use hand sanitiser before going on the turf.
- Minimise contact with surfaces e.g. barriers for access, turf fences, gates and dugout surfaces. Do not climb over the fences or barriers. Exit the turf immediately after your game.
- Staff, tournament officials and key volunteers are authorised to go between turfs to carry out roles critical to running the tournament including lights and watering.
- Note that limited toilets will be available on each turf. Toilets will be sanitised every day on a regular basis. The toilets upstairs in the pavilion will only be open for staff and spectators, players to use toilets at end of changing rooms (changing rooms themselves will remain closed).
- Ensure you take all your belongings with you when you depart.
- The café will be open with limited seating and social distancing protocols must be followed.

Players

Your Responsibilities

- Follow all the above protocols PLUS:
- Clean and disinfect your mouthguard and your hockey equipment before you arrive.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitiser before and after your game.
- Each player is responsible for their own PC gear with no sharing of PC safety equipment.
- Follow good health practices: no sharing drink bottles; clean mouthguards; no high fives or handshakes. No spitting or Bushman nose clearing on the turf as it poses a significant risk to other participants.
- All players are asked to take responsibility and name their bottles and bring enough water for their games as water fountains will not be operating.
- Follow all instructions on movement into and around the facility.
- Keep physical distance from spectators and teams from other pools
- Do not access the turfs until the previous teams have exited the turf.
- Exit the turf immediately after your game. The practice turf is available warm downs.

Team Responsibilities

- Nominate a liaison person for Tournament Organisers to communicate with re Covid-19 restrictions.
- Reinforce these responsibilities with your teams.
- Read all Health & Safety documentation on www.waikatohockey.org.nz
- Familiarise yourselves and your teams with the facility rules.
- Familiarise your teams with the contact tracing protocols.
- Follow the entry protocols and instructions from staff at each gate.
- Managers bring their own first aid kit with ice, gloves, own pen & sanitiser.
- Ensure the team maintains all applicable physical distancing requirements.
- Ensure there is no sharing of PC safety equipment.

Remember all other venue rules must also be followed. Especially the liquor licensing rules i.e. No alcohol to be brought into venue and follow the designated alcohol areas
