- ▶ Increase enjoyment of the game

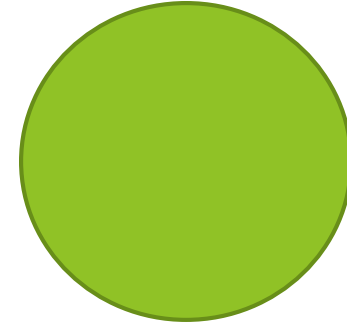

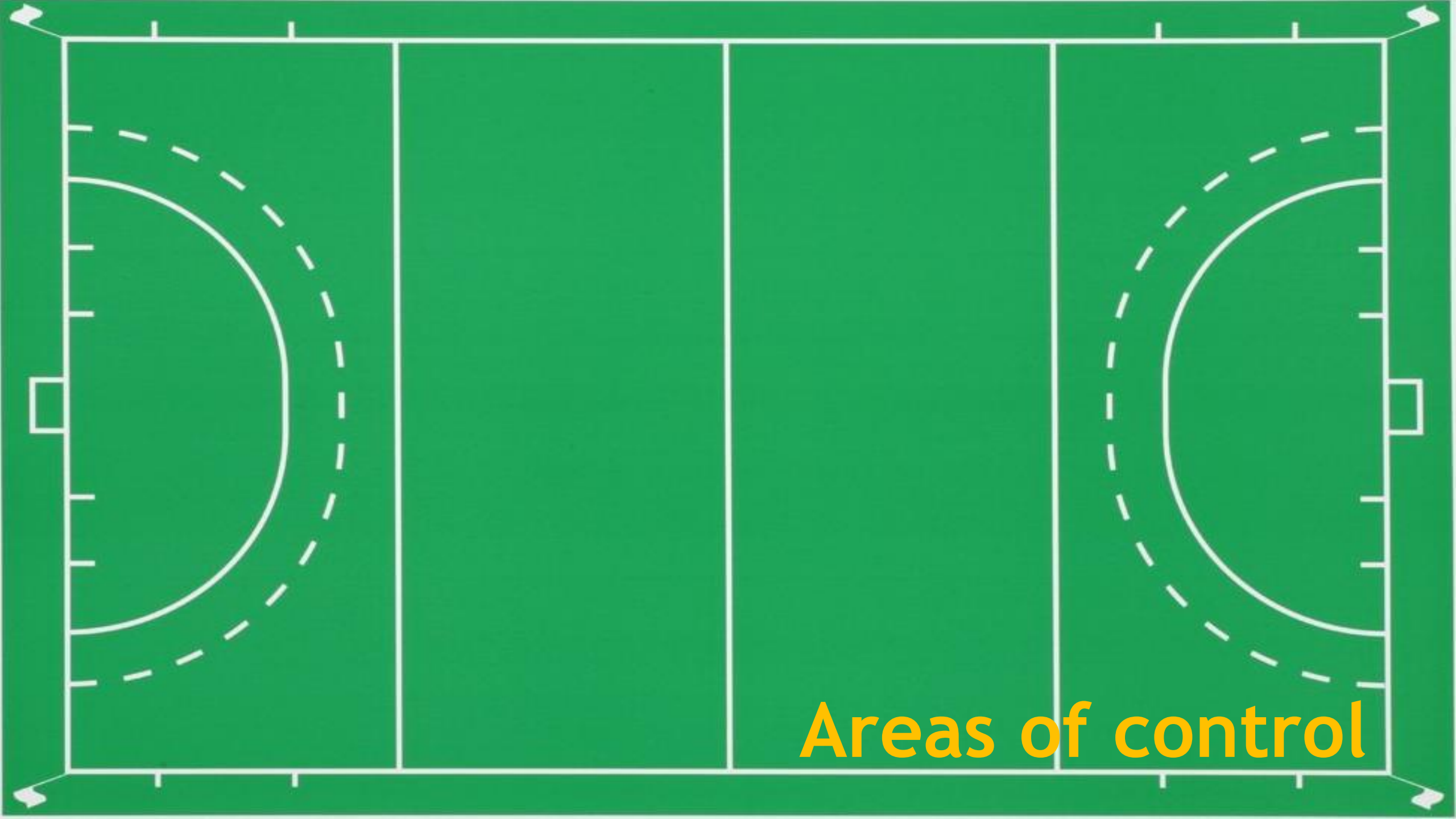

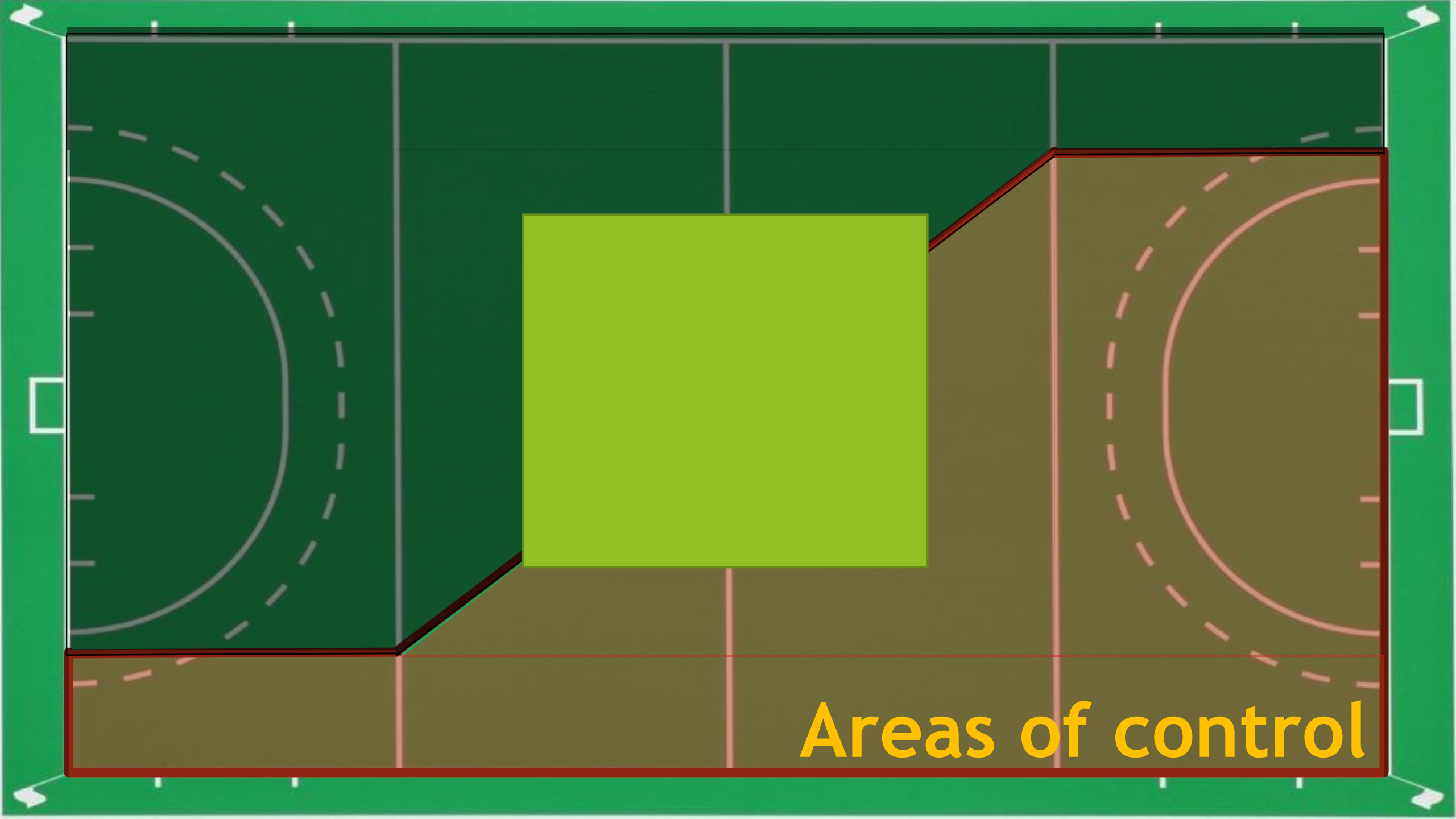

- 45 degree angle

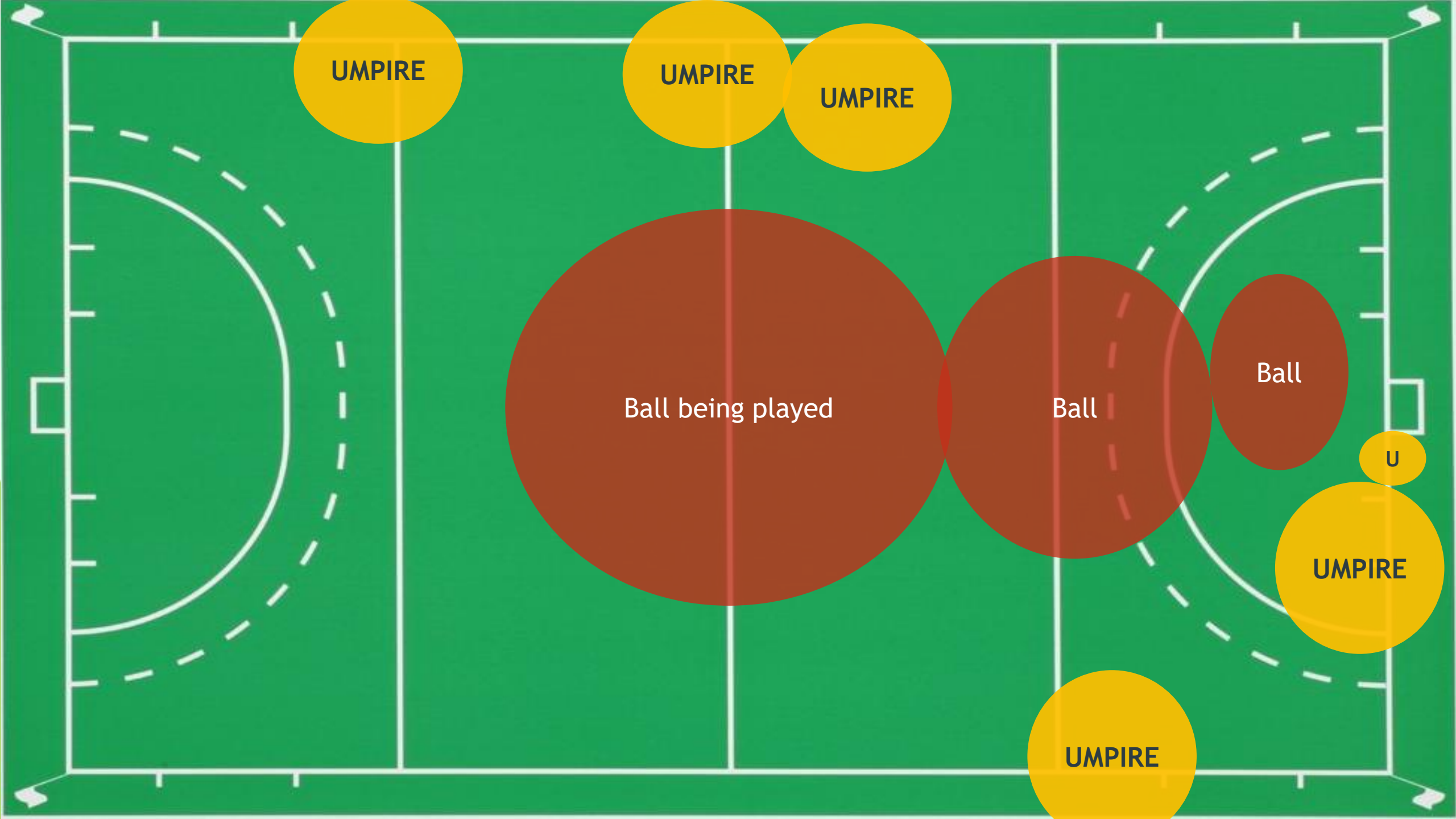

What Makes an Umpire?

1) Movement

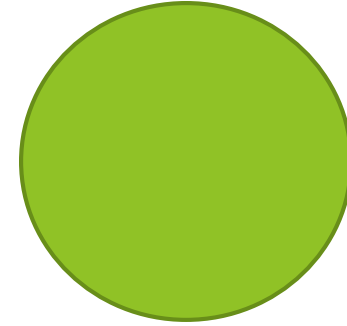
- Where should you stand:
 - Circle Attacks
 - Defensive free hits
 - Far side of the circle
 - In circle plays



What Makes an Umpire?

1) Movement

- Think about:
 - Closeness to right post
 - Exiting the circle
 - Movement downfield
 - Interaction with other umpire

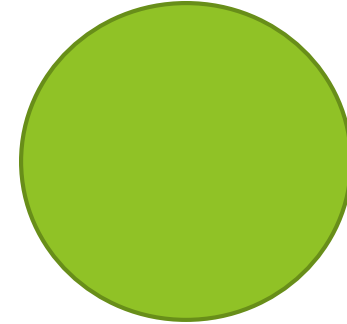


What Makes an Umpire?

2) Communication

A) Whistling

- Type of whistle
- Volume
- Sharpness and Tone
- Variation to reflect severity

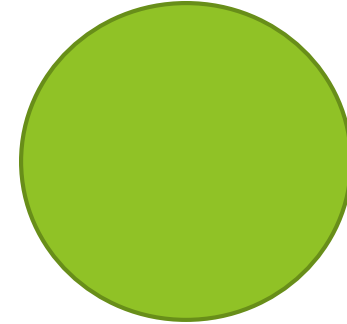


What Makes an Umpire?

2) Communication

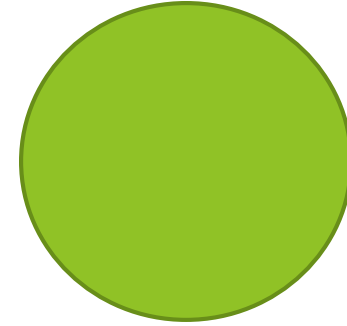
A) Whistling

- Timing
- Whistle is the main factor influencing perception



What Makes an Umpire?

2) Communication



B) Signaling

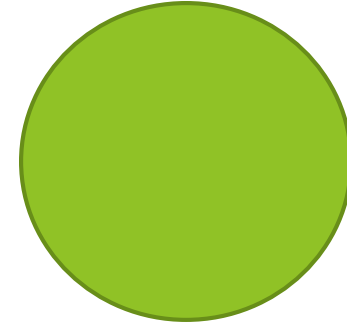
- Free hit, Penalty Corner, Penalty Stroke, Goal, Danger, Corner, 16 Yard hit
- Variations in Intensity

What Makes an Umpire?

2) Communication

B) Signaling

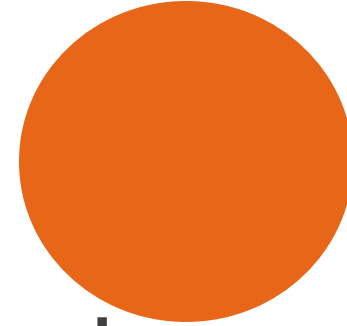
- FIH Signals only
- Also influence perception of umpire heavily

- Whistle and Signal variation and integration

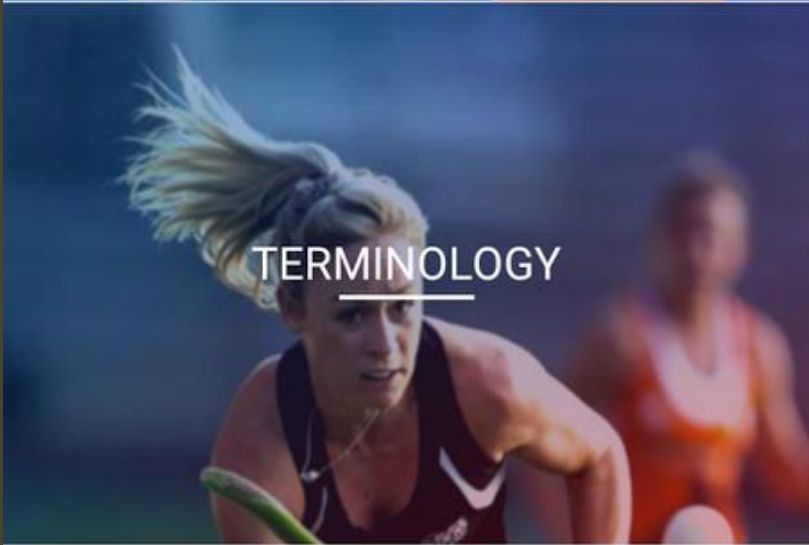

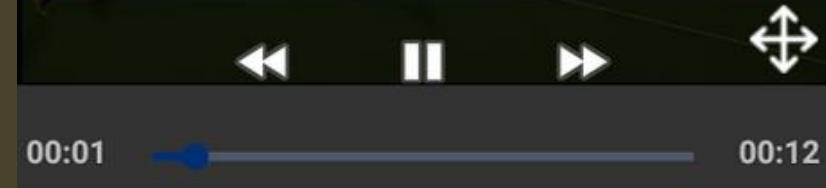

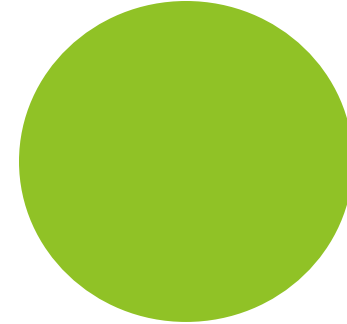

3) Thinking

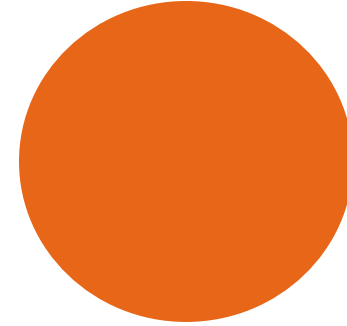
- Accidental v Deliberate

Does a noisy tackle always mean there is hacking?

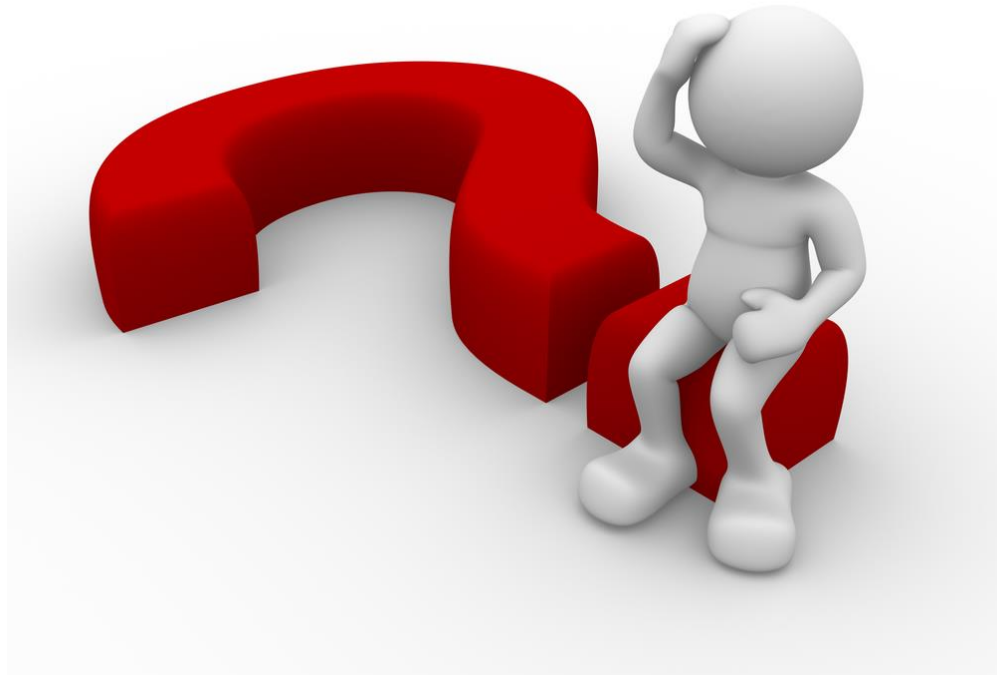
- **Toolbox**

How can we deal with players who aren't 5 at free hits?



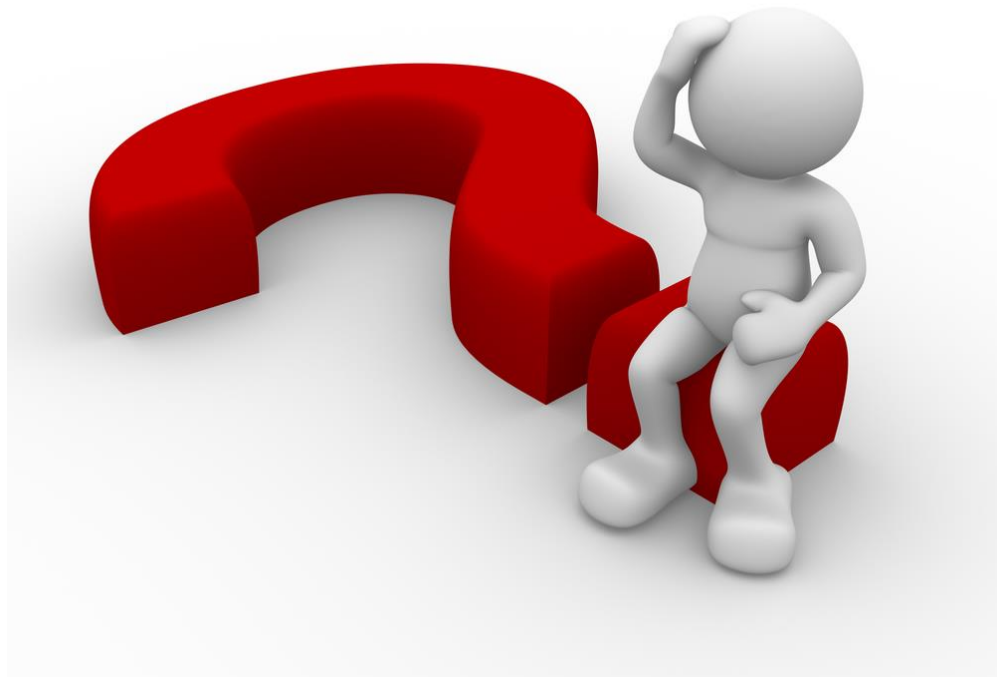

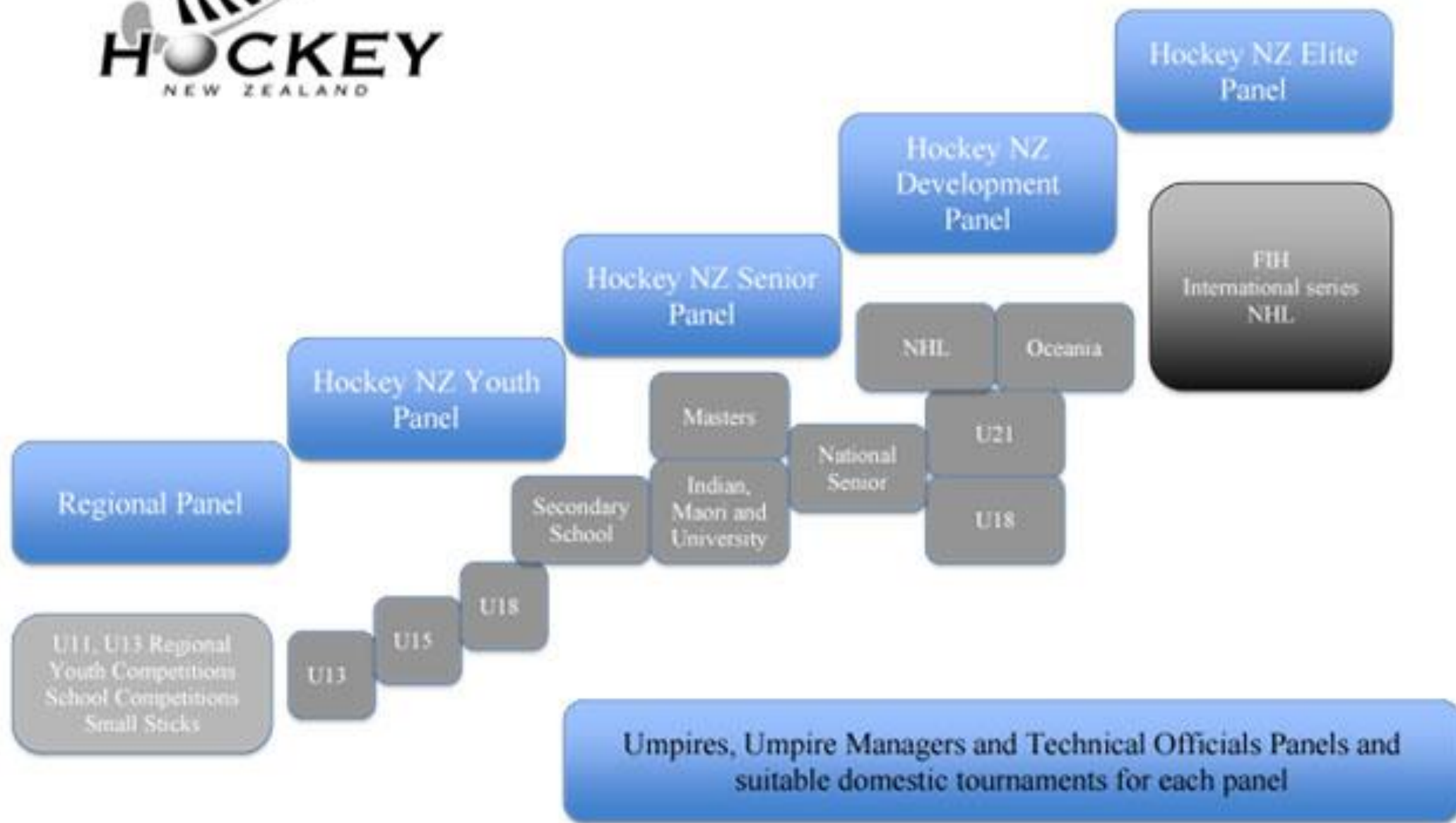

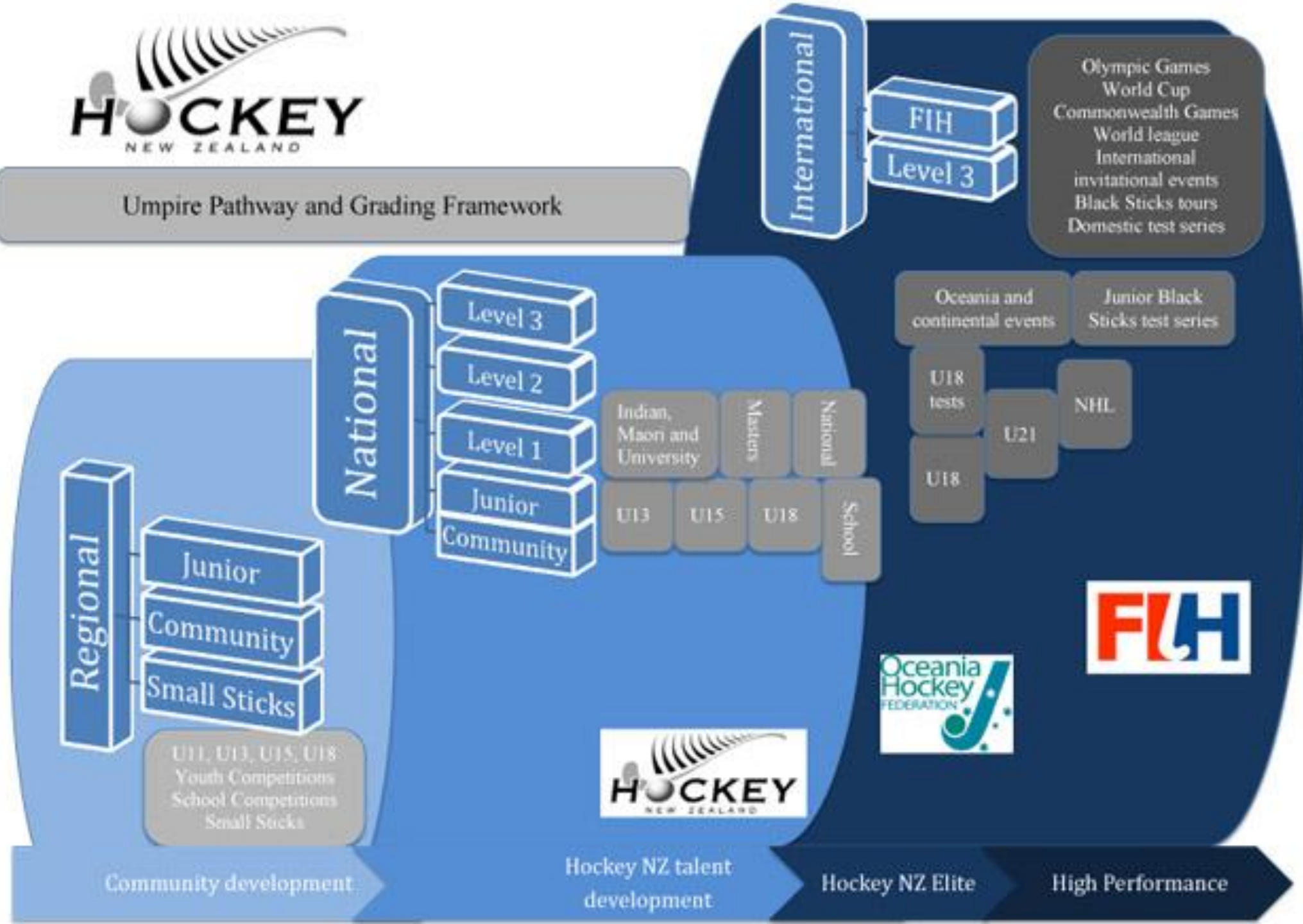
